Water Supply Availability and Water Management Strategies

Dear Mr. Boggus,

The Water User Group (WUG) New London is located in Rusk County within the water planning region known as the East Texas Regional Water Planning Area (ETRWPA, or Region I). The East Texas Regional Water Planning Group (ETRWPG) is in the process of updating the regional water plan for the ETRWPA to be adopted in 2021 Plan. For your consideration, please review the following tables, which summarize municipal water demand (Table 1), and sources (Table 2) for New London.

1 – Water Demands and Supplies are expressed in acre-feet per year (1 acre-feet per year = 893 gallons per day)

2 – A positive balance indicates that surplus supplies are available. A negative balance indicates a lack of supply availability to meet future needs. A future need is met by means of Water Management Strategies identified during the Regional Water Planning Process, if applicable.
